

# REPORT ON THE IMPACT OF THE PUPIL PREMIUM GRANT AT ST BERNADETTE'S CATHOLIC PRIMARY SCHOOL

## GLOSSARY

**FSM** = those children who qualify for free school meals

**Pupil Premium Grant** = the money the government has given our school to help FSM pupils who might be falling behind their classmates

**RAISEonline** = a detailed data report produced by the government to show schools how well they are doing compared to other schools in the country. In the report, the achievement and progress of FSM children is analysed. This report comes out in November every year.

**APS** = Average Points Score achieved in the Y2 and Y6 tests and assessments

**Progress Measure** = If pupils make the expected progress then this score is 100

Using the test data (RAISEonline 2013) the following points can be made:

### YEAR 6

- The Year 6 pupil premium group had a much better points score than this group nationally, i.e., 33 points in all areas, Level 5 across the board in Maths, Reading and Writing. The score of this group nationally was 26.7. This means that the St Bernadette's group was more than 6 terms ahead of their national FSM peers
- The Year 6 pupil premium group of 2013 had a higher score than the combined nonFSM group in school. This nonFSM had a score of 28.5.
- The Year 6 FSM group made much better progress than this group nationally, i.e., 104.4 for the in-school FSM group and 99.8 for the national FSM group
- The Year 6 pupil premium group (FSM) made better progress (104.4) than the nonFSM group at St Bernadette's (101.2)

### YEAR 2

- The Year 2 pupil premium group was close to the score of the national group. The combined results of Reading, Writing and Mathematics for the St Bernadette's FSM group was 14.1 and for the national group it was 14.3. However, there was a gap of 4+ points between the FSM group and the nonFSM group in school.
- The Mathematics score for the St Bernadette's FSM group was lowest at 13.0 points and it was furthest from the very high Maths score of the school's nonFSM group's 19 points.

NOTE: Additional Pupil Premium funding has been diverted to support the FSM group of 5 pupils now in Year 3. First half term tracking (Nov 2013) shows good progress. The new scores below show the October scores of the St Bernadette's Pupil Premium Group compared to the summer test scores of this national group (in brackets):

READING: 15.8 points (14.8)	WRITING: 15.8 points (13.5)	MATHS: 14.4 points (14.8)
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
