

## REPORT ON THE IMPACT OF THE PUPIL PREMIUM GRANT AT ST BERNADETTE'S CATHOLIC PRIMARY SCHOOL, 2014

### GLOSSARY

**Pupil Premium Grant** = the money the government has given our school to help disadvantaged pupils who are, or have been whilst they have been at primary school, eligible for free school meals. The grant is £1,300 per pupil.

**RAISEonline** = a detailed data report produced by the government to show schools how well they are doing compared to other schools in the country. In the report, the achievement and progress of free school meal children is analysed. This report comes out in November every year.

**APS** = Average Points Score achieved in the Y2 and Y6 tests and assessments

**Progress Measure** = If pupils make the expected progress then this score is 100

**Narrowing the Gap** = Schools should use the grant to raise the attainment of Pupil Premium pupils and narrow the gap between them and their peers.

**Disadvantaged pupils** = those pupils who receive the grant or have received it at some time in the last 6 years whilst they were at primary school.

**Others** = those pupils who are not eligible for free meals or the grant.

### RAISEonline 2014 - caution needed with some very small data groups

**Year 1 Phonics Screening Check: 100% of pupils reached the required standard, i.e., all Disadvantaged Pupils and all Others**

**Year 2 APS for St Bernadette's Y2 pupils (15)**

**(as published in RAISE, national scores in brackets)**

**However, there were 5 pupils, not 4, in the disadvantaged group for all assessments across Year 2, so the school records show the following:**

**YEAR 2 end-of-year** average scores for the groups at St Bernadette's were as follows (national 2014 scores in brackets):

In 2014, the gap between St Bernadette's Disadvantaged Group and their peers = 1.6

The gap between the Disadvantaged Group nationally and Others in England = 2.0

These in-school groups (now in Year 3) are closer to each other than the national ones.

## N A R R O W I N G   T H E   G A P

Even using the 2014 RAISE data (which excludes a high scoring disadvantaged pupil from this data group), over time, the disadvantaged St B's group has narrowed the gap between their scores and the national other group:

**YEAR 6 RAISE 2014:** average scores for the groups at St Bernadette's were as follows (NOTE: the national scores for 2014 for pupils in these groups are in brackets):

In 2014, the gap between St Bernadette's Disadvantaged Group and their peers = 1.8. The gap between the Disadvantaged Group nationally and Others in England = 2.4. The in-school gap is narrower than the national one.

In summer 2014, both Y2 and Y6 pupils at St Bernadette's had higher scores than the national ones in all areas (except GPS). This applies to both disadvantaged pupils & others who do not receive pupil premium.

Progress across Key Stage Two for St Bernadette's Year 6 of 2014 was also better than what is expected nationally (100), thus underlining the successful use of pupil premium funding to enhance staffing and resourcing for pupils who are at risk of not doing as well as they should. The progress measures are as follows:

Disadvantaged pupils at St Bernadette's: 102.2

Other pupils at St Bernadette's: 102.8
