

## The impact of Pupil Premium Funding on 2015 Test Results

Pupils who are eligible for additional funding provided by the government are: those who have been eligible for free school meals in the last 6 years and children who are looked after or have been adopted. The table below shows how our pupils compared to those in this group nationally and how they compared to pupils who were not eligible for the pupil premium. Substantial additional support was used (see Funding Forecast) to improve the outcomes of this disadvantaged group. These results will inform future teaching strategies.

NOTE: Overall, St Bernadette's disadvantaged group was just ahead of the non-disadvantaged national group, i.e., in 2015 this gap was closed

NOTE: Overall, St Bernadette's disadvantaged group was within close tolerance of this group nationally but behind in writing. They are two terms behind the non-disadvantaged national group. This group of 4 pupils has specific learning challenges and has had targeted support throughout KS1 funded through the PP grant. Support is continuing into Y3

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
