Pupil Premium Grant Expenditure: Forecast for 2018/19

The Pupil Premium Grant is allocated by the government to help schools:

- 1. Raise the attainment of disadvantaged pupils of all abilities so that they reach their full potential, closing the gap between this group and their NonPP peers
- 2. Support children with parents in the regular armed forces

The grant is allocated according to the number of FSM pupils recorded in the January 2018 school census as well as those in school who are known to have been eligible for free school meals at any time during R to Y6 - Ever6 pupils

The **Service Premium** is a grant to support pupils who have one or more parents serving in the regular armed forces. It should be used to provide pastoral support for pupils who may experience family mobility, parental absence from home for long periods of deployment or other related service issues. It should be accounted for separately from Ever6 funding.

Nature of support 2018/19

The funding from Pupil premium has been allocated in the following ways

- Maintain teaching assistant time to accelerate progress in phonics, reading, writing and maths across the whole school, so that small group work is more effective for those at risk of falling behind
- Focus support and resources for target pupils in Year Groups where there are
 highest numbers of PPG pupils to improve progress in reading, writing and maths.
 Additional 12 hours of 1-to-1 support. This will be adjusted to take account of any
 pupils at risk of getting "stuck" or falling behind in their progress

- Ensure pupils in receipt of PPG are supported to participate fully in school trips and the annual residential
- Fund activities and strategies to improve attendance and punctuality for this vulnerable group, including booster groups
- Continue resourcing areas for small group work, including remodelled staff area
- Support good quality planning and monitoring of high numbers of PP pupils
- Safeguard PP support for 3 additional mornings per week
- Provide additional pastoral support, as required, by 4 service pupils on roll
