

## 2018 Test Results at St Bernadette's Catholic Primary School

### KEY STAGE 2 Tests 2018

Context: For the last three years, 11-year-olds have been tested on a new, more demanding curriculum. Pupils are tested (in May of their final year) in English Grammar, Spelling and Punctuation; English Reading; and Mathematics (both Arithmetic and Reasoning). Their teachers assess their writing during Year 6 to agree the standard they have reached by the end of the year. The results of the tests (SATs) and assessments are published by the government in July so that these can be included in each pupil's end-of-year report.

If pupils are performing as expected for 11-year-olds, the score will be 100+. The score range runs from 80 to 120. Children are described as achieving a "high standard" or "working at greater depth" if their score is 110 or more.

To help parents get some idea of how our school is doing when we are compared to all other primary schools in England, the scores for St Bernadette's, the national scores and, where available, the county outcomes are given in the tables below:

**Greater Depth:** St Bernadette's improved in all areas. 1 pupil scored full marks ("raw score") in two papers (Arithmetic & Grammar and Punctuation); 4 pupils scored full marks in one paper (Arithmetic).

### Key Stage 1 Tests 2018

Context: The national assessments for 7-year-olds have also changed this year. Over the last three years, the standards children are expected to reach at the end of Year 2 in primary school have been adjusted upwards. Just like Key Stage 2, the expected score for the end of year tests is 100 in each subject. Teachers mark the tests; their marking is then checked by other professionals; and a score is calculated. Teachers also use their detailed knowledge of pupils' classwork during the year to get a clear and fair picture of attainment for each pupil. This then gives an overall picture of what proportion of the year group is working at or above the expected standard. Teachers also identify those pupils who need additional support in order to move more quickly to the new, raised standard.

2018 Year 1 Phonics Check for 6 year-olds - the government also sets an early reading test for pupils in Year 1. In 2018, all but 2 of the year group attained the expected standard (88%).
