Pupil Premium Impact Report

(Using the "*Inspection Summary Report*" published Jan 2019 and other national and local comparative data)

2016 = 28% 2017 = 28% 2018 = 23%

Pupil Premium Funding is additional money that comes into the school budget to support our pupils who are entitled to free school meals (23% of pupils in 2018). The money is used to provide extra support and resources to help children do as well as they possibly can. The rigorously marked tests and assessments at the end of each Key Stage (year 2 and Year 6) are used as evidence to review and adjust individual support.

The Service Pupil Premium is additional money for pastoral support for children who have parent/parents in the armed forces - 4 pupils recorded in the 2018 January census.

From 2016, end-of-key-stage assessments (SATs) were changed - children had to undertake harder tests. From these assessments we can see how well pupils entitled to extra help, funded through the pupil premium grant, did. We can see what percentage of this group reached the new, expected standard. Additionally, we can work out how the results of the group not entitled to this additional funding compared to the class and the national cohort.

I M P A C T:

The Pupil Premium Grant (£29, 040 in the latest year) has been allocated according to the spending plan and forecast. In particular, the additional TA time; one-to-one precision teaching; and a clear focus on year groups with the most pupils eligible for the grant - all these have made a real difference. See the data below for supporting evidence. The results of the Y6 group of 2018, with 27% of its pupils receiving support through the grant, show the impact the grant has made.
